Candidate Preview

Last month's meeting of the Virginia-Highland Civic Association featured the two candidates for the Georgia Senate 37th District, which includes the Virginia-Highland neighborhood.

The man who has held the position for eight years, Ed Garrard, described himself as a "commercial real estate developer" and stressed his seniority and experience in the Senate. Garrard defended his opposition to Sunday liquor sales and paramutual betting, contending that, in his opinion, the problems that would arise from them

Todd Evans, a lawyer by profession, stressed his ability to deal with the business of the Senate and promised to act as an advocate for neighborhood residents. Evans set forth a proposal to use neighborhood residents as a volunteer Senate staff and also vowed to tackle problems of double taxation of district residents and disposal of the cleared highway land.

Virginia-Highland residents will have the opportunity to vote in the Senate primary on August 10th. If you are not registered to vote, you have until July 9th to do so. Voters may register at the library or at local branches of the C & S, Trust Company, and Fulton National banks.

Saturday, July 3rd is the date of the annual Virginia-Highland July 4th Picnic. Watch for a flyer with details of how you can get involved in the fun.

The Virginia-Highland Civic Association is sponsoring a voter registration drive on Friday, June 25th, from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., and on Saturday, June 26th, from 1-5 p.m., in the parking lot of the Fulton Federal Bank, corner Todd Road and Virginia Avenue.

You must be registered by July 9th in order to vote in the Democratic Primary on August 10th. Among the issues to be decided will be the selection of a Democratic senatorial candidate for the 37th District, of which Virginia-Highland is part.

You need to register if you have:

- * never registered to vote in Georgia
- * moved into Fulton County from another county in Georgia
- * changed your name or address
- * not voted within the past three years
