Atlanta Police Department:

Lt. Crowder – Zone 6 Evening Watch Commander. Package crimes are increasing. Best way to combat this is to develop a relationship with neighbors and ask them to pick up packages when they are delivered. Bike thefts are also prevalent. djcrowder@atlantaga.gov

Question about Bird Scooters: Call Officers if Bird Scooters are seen on the BeltLine, Piedmont Park, and BeltLine.

Question about parking in bike lanes: Call APD if cars are parked in bike lanes.

Elected Public Officials & Municipal Representatives:

Jennifer Ide

City Council is contemplating legislation to address dockless scooters and bikes. Issue is currently before the Transportation Committee.

No updates on 10th and Monroe proposed development. Developer has cancelled all meetings. Jennifer Ide and Commissioner Keene feel that the developer and city are at an impasse – the current version of the project will not get support from the City Planning Department. Jennifer supports a restart of the process with new process at Invest Atlanta.

Need to develop key principles so that next proposal will be more realistic and consist with existing planning.

June 28 Monroe Complete Streets Meeting – Grady 7:00. Will discuss quick updates and realignment of the street. Faye Demassimo is no longer the GM of Renew Atlanta. Tom Weyandt Jr. (Morningside resident) is the new Interim GM of Renew Atlanta.



Council is working on budget – hoping to pass budget next Monday. Looking to increase funding for safety.

Planning Committee

Variances

V-18-66; 825 Drewry NE; R-4 (deferral from May cycle of meetings)

Applicants and homeowners Lindsay and Tyler Wheeler request the following variances

- 1) reduce the east side yard setback from 7 feet to 3 feet
- 2) reduce the west side yard setback from 7 feet to 2 feet
- 3) reduce the rear yard setback from 15 to 10 feet

to allow for construction of an addition to the residence and detached two-story garage.

Applicants updated previous site plan and applicable referral certificate reducing lot coverage to under 50%. Applicant stated they would prefer to save tree in middle of back yard but removal may be required. Applicant also is aware of potential issues with grass strip in driveway related to the grade changes and will use available methods to assure its effectiveness. All surrounding neighbors have been notified of the application.

The Planning Committee voted unanimously to support this application and appreciate the applicant's diligent attention to the variance process.

Motion to Recommend Approval CARRIES on Unanimous Show of Hands

V-18-105; 659 Cooledge NE; R-4

Applicant and homeowner Steve Lynott request the following variances

- 1) reduce the east side yard setback from 7 feet to 3 feet
- 2) reduce the west side yard setback from 7 feet to 3 feet 7 inches

to allow for an addition to the residence (west) and installation of an external spiral staircase (east).

Applicant will be reducing lot coverage from 63.8% to 61.8% by removing currently-bricked pool apron and replacing with grass. No tree impacts indicated and applicant has committed to removing debris (not on survey) to allow for additional ground permeability. Additionally, applicant is coordinating with adjacent neighbors to manage stormwater runoff. All surrounding neighbors have been notified.

The Planning Committee voted unanimously to support this application.



Motion to Recommend Approval CARRIES on Unanimous Show of Hands

V-18-153; 901 Highland View NE; R-4; re-application

Applicant Stacey Rainwater of Survey Systems on behalf of homeowner Stephen McRae request the following variances

- 1) reduce the east side yard setback from the 7 feet to 3 feet (existing)
- 2) reduce front yard setback to from 35 feet to 15 feet (existing)

for the construction of a new residence.

This is re-application (at the city's request) for the same variances approved in November 2017. Construction commenced several months ago.

Lot coverage will rise from 47.1 % to 49.9. No tree issues were observed. Surrounding neighbors have been notified.

The Planning Committee unanimously recommended approval.
