#### **Atlanta Police Department - Lieutenant White**

-provided an update on Zone 6. 31 crime incidents in the past month. Lt. White recommended we share the Clean Car campaign to the community to avoid car break-ins. Challenging area due to the volume of visitors to restaurants and the Beltline.

-Update on Colonnades Condos at 734 & 742 North Highland Ave (add detail) - Lt. recommended 2 things: 1) If male trespasses property, advise dispatch through 911. Lt. White will dispatch officers accordingly. When officers arrive, need a representative from the condo association to advise the authorities to verbally confirm 'criminal trespassing'. 2) Can contact Lt. - District 6 Councilman Alex Wan provided an update on 6 key points (Alex contact info 404-330-6049)
  - Road in front #19 Fire Station Alex in touch with Atlanta DOT. They confirmed contractor will be completing work starting next week. Upon DOT completion, the road will be correctly repaired
  - Cheshire Bridge Redirect the temporary redirect is in progress 1 lane will be open in each direction by 10/31
  - Infrastructure Bond Alex's office has the list of Projects submitted for the bond. He is reviewing incl John Howell park renovation, North Highland Ave repair. Will need our help by end of year to solidify our plans and reach consensus on priorities
  - Property Assessments he's heard criticism of how fair the #'s are in our neighborhood.
     City Council is looking into the residential cost discrepancies versus the valuation of commercial buildings



- New Building Commissioner started this month. Alex asked his office to prioritize getting
  a better system in place/people to track permitting, etc. Code enforcement has not had
  strong leadership.
