Report from Education Committee on the Midtown Cluster rezoning and community meeting - VHCA committee held a community meeting last week (30 in attendance) to understand concerns and determine what role VHCA could play in the process of the APS rezoning that was put on the table in the last 90-120 days. APS removed VAHI from the options on the table proposed for the re-clustering of Midtown. Hopeful that SPARK will not be included in future options. Need to stay close to what APS is proposing and share that directly with our community. We need to give a voice to the neighborhood to represent our recommendations.

Old Business

Transportation



- VHE Transportation Assessment- highest number of younger children will be attending this school. Conducted an audit of signage, school zoning signage, cross walks, lanes, traffic, etc. Met with Councilman Wan talked e about bike lanes on Virginia, a pedestrian scramble at North Highland and Virginia, traffic tables at Park & Virginia had a very positive meeting provided candid feedback. Low hanging fruit before school opens incl stop signs, repainting crosswalks (7), traffic tables, ATL 25 mph standards (currently 30/35MPH), pilot program for pedestrian scramble for Virginia & Highland, add School Zone signs, 2 new 4-way stops at Highland View and Ponce Terrace, Drewry, a couple new 3-way stops and a few speed tables. Not meant to be an exclusive list but a starting point to put a plan into action before the Fall.
- Board vote to support advancing Phase I Board approved unanimously to proceed with recommendation for Alex's office to push forward on plans and legislation

New Business

- Planning Board vote on Portman Holdings' Ponce and Ponce Mixed-Use Rezoning Application and West & East Site Plans
 - Board in support of detailed recommendation made by Planning committee all board members approved. Motion to support.
 - Traffic study needs to be completed for Barnett. Reco is to conduct the traffic study this Fall once VirginiaHighland elementary school opens. Needs to be part of future Master Plan.
