#### **Elected Public Officials & Municipal Representatives -**

- City Councilman District 6 Alex Wan
  - Budget hearings started last week. Will be adopted in June. \$790MM is total budget (2010 - was about \$550MM.) With Aviation and other - total COA budget of \$3B. Funding is available. His preference is to focus the funding initiatives against things we can be successful at.

Alex's recommendation for focus: Transportation, Buildings, Parks

- Transportation thank you to our committee. He introduced a list of recommendations that we supported. Reviewing them in front of the city constituency tomorrow. He expects them to get approved. VHCA to remember to ask for a timeline once the project gets approved so we can be prepared as a community. Consider getting Michelle Olympiadis involved to see if we can get implemented before VH Elementary opens.
- 10th and Monroe project met today with the project team. anticipate constructions to start late summer into September. Will be done in 3 phases. Beltline is involved in the process including bikes coming and going. All work must be completed by 2025. Intersection will have a distinct demarcation including a raised pathway above the street.
- Gun Violence discussion: recent spike and impact to local community
  - City focused on ensuring gun safety in the city. Andre Dickens, ATL Mayor supportive of gun safety. APD has been focused on it for the past 4+ years. Lot of car break ins . APD is trying to solve the crimes as quickly as possible. License plate readers were effective in last week's effort to find the perpetrator. Key lies in the state legislature.



- Get guns out of the cars.
- Pressure on Fulton County for Mental Health programs.
- Advocacy at State Level
- Difficult to change Open Carry but might be an opportunity to focus on exemptions for open carry like Schools.
- Consider De-escalation lessons and conflict resolution at community level
- Strategy: APD is the source of gun incidents. Talk to Zone Commanders and ask for a monthly view. Is there a database of gun incidents? Can we publish on a consistent and clear basis?
- Alex to confirm 'what is status of Buy Back program?, do we have data collection on gun incidents?
- Consider a Town Hall to focus w/ Fulton County to discuss Mental Health, APD to discuss Gun violence/safety,

  - John Howell Estimated \$1.5-3MM investment needed. Can be done in stages.
     Consider starting with Storm Water as stage 1. Alex Wan has allocated \$300K towards stage 1. Stage 2 could be focused on Playgrounds.
