The Georgia Power Company plans to construct a 350 foot microwave transmitting tower near the corner of Virginia Avenue and Ponce De Leon Place.

Members of the Association objected to the tower construction before the Atlanta-Fulton County Board of Adjustment but the Board approved construction anyway.
